

Last week (15th Oct) an article in the Ross Shire Journal suggested that the TDDT are trying to rename the 'Tarbat Peninsula'. We wish to emphatically confirm that this is **not** the case and we would like to clear up any misunderstandings.

As part of the TDDT tourism Strategy, the brand identity will **not** be renaming any individual areas, it will 100% support the new umbrella brand for the whole District and as part of an ongoing marketing campaign, we will then highlight and champion each area that makes up Ward 7, including the Tarbat Peninsula.

This project has been going on for a number of years and has included work with Caledonian University on a Design Thinking document for the Seaboard Memorial Hall, followed by two large open consultations, open AGM's and many steering Group discussions with tourism representatives from each community in Ward 7.

The strategy is made up of four essential pillars; Identity, Information, Infrastructure and Innovation which includes our Youth Heritage Project.
